

A word from Andrew

I recently preached on the scripture from John 10 where Jesus says, 'My sheep listen to my voice'. When you think about the concept of Jesus speaking to you, you might think of the way that Jesus spoke to St Paul on the Damascus road and imagine that you'd be blessed if Jesus spoke to you once in a lifetime. That particular story is a dramatic one. Paul was 'breathing out murderous threats against the Lord's disciples', and Jesus dealt with him in a decisive way because he wanted to stop Paul in his tracks, to reveal truth to him and to set him on a different course. Paul's life thereafter was one where Jesus spoke to him all the time to give him instructions and revelation to enable Paul to carry out his Christ-given task to take the gospel to the Gentiles.


In John 10, Jesus is likening himself to a shepherd, the good shepherd, and we are the sheep in his flock. In the understanding of this imagery, a shepherd would be speaking to his sheep all through the day as he led them to pastures and cared for them. I think this should be our expectation of Jesus' desire to connect with us. I want to encourage us to put some effort into hearing Jesus speak, so that we are sure of his voice. Then we can be obedient to his voice. Outside me at present, there are a number of large trees with rook colonies in them. Rooks are very noisy birds and drown out the other bird sound. However, it is possible to tune out from the rooks and to hear the sound of the smaller birds round about. You have to stay focussed and give the matter your full attention, or you will soon just be hearing the rooks again! The rooks are not bad. They are just very loud! If you didn't tune out from the rooks, you might easily say of this location, that the rooks are the only birds speaking! In listening to Jesus, I wonder what we need to tune out from? Our devices, certainly! But there may be other distractions in our lives that are big noises for us. How can we tune them out and listen to Jesus. We might hear him speak in prayer. We will certainly hear him speak if we read scripture.


I think many of us know that we hear important things from Jesus, but we receive so much information from various sources all the time, that we don't stay with that important thing long enough to let it sink in. Information overload will dilute what Jesus is saying to us.

Yesterday we clambered down a steep set of steps to a beach. It was lovely and we had it to ourselves. It was a sunny day and there was so much to see and enjoy. We didn't rush away, but instead we lingered. The tide was on the way out and over about an hour, the beach opened up to be a much larger beach with pools and rock formations to explore. And then we were delighted

to see two seals in the water. If we hadn't lingered, we would have felt connection with the place because it was so beautiful, but by lingering we had so much more connection. I think that says something about 'My sheep hear my voice'. We can hear Jesus speak but there is a time for lingering in his presence, when we will hear so much more, and connect more fully with him.

News from St. Mary's

Our next quiz in the Village Hall is on Saturday 7 June, with the questions being set by Ian Smart. Last time we had a full house with twelve teams and we hope to repeat that on this occasion. Again this is seen to be a very relaxed social event, with teams coming regularly from outside the village.

In July we have our Patronal Festival one week and our 820th anniversary celebrations the next. This has presented a challenge to our team of flower ladies, which they have accepted eagerly. It will be blue and white for the former and a monastic theme for the latter.

The 820th celebrations are being held in conjunction with the whole community, so on Saturday 12 July, St. Mary's Church will be open from 10:00 – 16:00, welcoming all to admire our Grade I listed building, have a cup of coffee and hear what it means to the community as a whole. At the same time the Village Hall will be open with people showing different aspects of life in the village from 820 years ago to the current day. The church will be represented here also.

On Sunday 13 July there will be a service of Holy Communion at 10:00 taken by Bishop Andrew of Ramsbury. It is hoped that we will fill the church with people that we may not normally see.

After the service, at noon, there will be a bring and share lunch in the Village Hall, at which all will be welcome. This not just for church members, but for the community at large. 



Looking around the village this evening (Sunday 11 May) after a busy day collecting all the poppies to return to storage, it looked so bare and lacking in colour.



Over 8,500 poppies were on show for VE Day with new ideas on the green and in private gardens and poppies on the way in and out of the village on the verges.

What a relief it must have been 80 years ago when finally the war was over in Europe, but we must not forget that fighting continued in Burma and Japan.

We have been asked to remember VJ Day by someone in the village whose father died as a result of his time in Japan and also there are others with family connections wanting to remember peace in Burma so we will do a small display on Ham Green with stories about the relatives on the railings.

The photographs show the 80 and the 40 poppies on sticks representing the 40 names on the war memorial. Remembering those who could not rejoice when peace came.



There are still poppies being made which is wonderful and we will be selling broaches in November as before, and we hope you will be thrilled to know that the display will be back at St Katharine's in November for Remembrance Day.
